The film features older people transported back to the night President Kennedy was shot. Younger people were involved in the filming allowing shared experiences and learning. One of the aims of the film was to redefine old age and infirmity. It looks at the physical frailties of old age and the preconceptions of other people.

Drummond High School, Edinburgh will be talking about their intergenerational project with a local care home and the Citadel Youth Centre will be presenting their project the 'Herstory Project' a social history group involving young mums and older women.
